-2015 REFERENDUM SUPPORTED STEM (SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, MATH) SPENDING OF \$778,000. THE APRIL 4TH REFERENDUM SUPPORTS SPENDING \$6,000,000-\$9,000,000- What has changed to require such an increase?

-PROJECTED \$1,818,589 DEFICIT-SCHOOL YEAR 2020/2021- DOES THIS MEAN THERE IS A POSSIBILITY OF *ANOTHER* TAX INCREASE IN 2020/2021? (Source: Baird Consolidation Study-Fiscal Analysis dated November 2015)

-FACILITY STUDY COMMITTEE (FSC) TIME WAS CUT SHORT- FSC volunteers were told "you'll have all the time needed to get it done correctly," but the time available was cut short and the FSC cut short its deliberation. Several FSC members requested additional time from the Board, but the request was *denied* because the Board didn't want to miss this upcoming voting period. (Source: FSC members)

-A REFERENDUM VOTE CAN BE APPROVED AT ANY TIME AS LONG AS THERE ARE 70 DAYS BETWEEN BOARD APPROVAL AND THE VOTING DATE- the rejected Middle School referendum of October 3, 1995 was brought back to a vote 77 days later. The ballot count increased 23% on the December 12, 1995 referendum. Estimated cost of holding a vote on a non-traditional election day is estimated at \$10,000-\$15,000 (1/1000th of a percent of the total interest cost of this referendum). Why was the FSC group's time cut short? [(Source: Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI))]

-CARDINAL INDUSTRIES (MAYVILLE MANUFACTURING?) - COST, LIABILITY, CHILD LABOR LAWS? UNKNOWN OR JUST NOT EXPLAINED TO THE PUBLIC? Wouldn't a pilot-program between MHS and local manufacturing entities, where students get hands-on production time in an operating manufacturing environment complete with mentoring by production engineers, sales personnel and executive leadership, be the most prudent first step? Do the Taxpayers really want to finance another technical college?

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-MAYVILLE SCHOOLS OPERATE AT 67%-72% OF DESIGNED STUDENT CAPACITY- Parkview-67%; High School-70%; Middle School-72%. Is a **23,000 sq. ft. addition** to the high school necessary? (Sources: District Headcount figures and District FTE Projections)

-MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT COUNT IS 191 STUDENTS BELOW CAPACITY; PARKVIEW STUDENT COUNT IS ONLY 192 STUDENTS- Is it time to combine Parkview (5k-2nd grade) with the Middle School (3rd-8th grade) and open the new 5k-8th Grade **CARDINAL SCHOOL**? Is it wasteful spending to dump \$1,331,000 into Parkview, a school that could be closed if an investment of \$2M-\$3M is put into the Middle School?

-SIX (6) NEW ELEMENTARY CLASSROOMS- added to the Middle School would cost **\$2M-\$3M*** and help ensure a successful transition to the **CARDINAL SCHOOL**. Operating costs of two (2) separate schools would be reduced/eliminated and overall efficiencies and educational initiatives would abound. **Shouldn't EARLY LEARNERS be the priority?** (*Source: Architectural/Production representative involved with this project)

-25-YEAR vs CONVENTIONAL 20-YEAR TERM- provides a lower annual tax bill; however, the longer term will cost an additional **\$2,335,213** in Finance Charges. **It'll surprise you to find out that 32% of the referendums \$36,000,000 total cost is INTEREST!** Another surprise you can expect is your Property TAXES will probably **INCREASE 24% +/- 3%** on average. -INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE MEMBERS SUGGESTED A SEPARATE \$9,000,000 QUESTION- there is a legitimate \$9M "need" to repair, replace and update the high school's infrastructure. **A separate referendum question for "needs" was rejected by the Mayville School Board - Reason: Board feared a 2nd question to cover "wants" would be rejected by the community. This is one reason everything is lumped together in a single referendum question!** (Source: FSC members)

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
